
ABOUT GAFCON IV:

The Anglican Church in North America (ACNA) is a member of the Global Anglican Future Conference (GAFCON). GAFCON is a global family of millions of authentic, orthodox Anglicans, many in South America and Africa., and is chaired by our Archbishop, Foley Beach.

The Conference will be assembling in Rwanda this April with representatives of provinces from around the world. Our own Fr. Jim has been asked to join the ACNA delegation, which will be led by Archbishop Foley. He will be watching history unfold as there are a number of important issues being faced, not the least of which is reviewing the role of the Archbishop of Canterbury in the orthodox church.

It's a great honor for Fr. Jim to be asked to participate in this event. That, coupled with the work George Peagler is doing in canonical matters, gives our little parish an outsized role in the life of the Province. We don't want to be prideful but have reason to be proud. Keep Fr. Jim in your prayers as he travels to and participates in the Conference.
