We were reminded of the centrality and supremacy of Christ at the recent GAFCON IV conference held in Kigali, Rwanda April 17-21. Gafcon is a movement of orthodox Anglicans committed to upholding the apostolic faith--the unchanging word--in the midst of a changing world. Gafcon is the body that has authenticated our

province, the Anglican Church in North America, as a genuine expression of the Anglican Way, and it is their fellowship that grafts us into the Anglican Communion.

In Kigali, over 1300 delegates from over 50 countries gathered with the hope of reviving, reforming, and resetting the Anglican communion. The Kigali Commitment, the official statement the conference produced, is the fruit of that hope. It is a strong statement establishing a new direction for the Anglican Communion. I encourage you to read the whole statement for yourself. We've linked to it in the body of the email that delivered this newsletter.

The aim of the Kigali Commitment is to ground the Anglican Communion more deeply in the Headship of Christ by giving a bigger role to the Word of God, the Holy Scriptures. This is a welcome aim, and I am praying that well crafted structures emerge that support this goal.

The real upshot of all this is that we are part of a large, diverse, global fellowship of Christians with vibrant and authentic faith. The presence of the Holy Spirit was palpable at many points over the course of GAFCON IV. I was honored to be able to represent you in Kigali as a delegate and serve alongside so many courageous brothers and sisters in Christ. God is on the move in his church, bringing many to glory through the reign of his risen Son our Lord Jesus Christ.

Let us rejoice to be called his people!

We are busy this morning with our weekly distribution. We are serving approximately 390 families each month. We have been able to purchase shelf stable milk that will be distributed next month in each food box.

As always, we appreciate volunteers that take time to help with packing and distribution. We could not open the doors without volunteer help!

We are greatly appreciative of food and financial donations. We would not be able to give out the food boxes each week without something to fill the boxes.
