In a recent gospel lesson, Jesus asked one key question and made one crucial promise. In Matthew 16:15 Jesus asked his disciples "Who do you say that I am?" In Matthew 16:18, Jesus promised them "I will build my church." Let's think again about how this question and this promise inform what we are doing here at St John's.

We'll start with the question. Jesus' simple question, "Who do you say that I am?" is of crucial importance. If we are willing and able to join with Peter in confessing that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God, then it follows that our whole lives may have to be re-organized on account of that confession.

If we grant Jesus those titles, we also must grant him the authority that comes with those titles. If Jesus is the Christ, then he should be Lord of every facet of our lives: our habits, our actions, our relationships, our desires.

We must learn to live for the one who died for us.

Now the promise: "I will build my church." When we acknowledge that Jesus is Lord and Savior, we become part of something far bigger than ourselves. We join Jesus' family--we are each adopted by God the Father.

Only Jesus has the authority and the credentials to make this magnificent inclusion possible. He is the master builder who is building up his one great congregation. He is the good shepherd who is in charge of multiplying his one flock.

We are called to live a consistent life of witness to the fact that Jesus is the Christ. When we live in this way, speaking with courage and patience and acting with obedience and compassion, then Jesus can work through us to build his church.

We are confessors and witnesses; Jesus is the builder.

At St John's, our congregational mission statement is loving, proclaiming, and serving Christ that others may know him. I believe our mission statement dovetails smoothly with Jesus' teaching in these verses, and I am excited for the opportunities we have coming up to offer that compelling

witness to the wonderful truth that Jesus is the Christ and the Son of the Living God.

Every Friday morning at 6:45 AM, we're preparing to feed the Southland Varsity Football Team. The players and coaches arrive beginning at 7:00 AM in the Parish Hall and the meal begins promptly at 7:15. Around 7:30, there's a 5-minute devotion centered around the Bible.

The breakfast is prepared by Carter's Fried Chicken, consisting of scrambled eggs, cheese grits, bacon, sausage, cathead biscuits, jam, orange juice, milk and water. It's quite the sight to see 42 hungry big football players eating-Wowthey can eat.


